Reminds the United States of America that removing the embargo would allow US companies to partake in the leasing program for blocks of the oil basins discovered in Cuba, which is estimated to be one of the top 20 reserves in the world;
Strongly urges the United States of America to help the Cuban government develop its own

- 5. <u>Strongly urges</u> the United States of America to help the Cuban government develop its own equipment and expertise so that they are able to handle any large oil spills, as if oil spills were to occur, there would be severe damage to densely-populated areas of Cuba and the American state of Florida;
